### I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

#### III. PRESENTATIONS

- 1. Fire Chief Report regarding facilities, apparatus and equipment, emergency operations, training, management activities, personnel matters, property tax, sales tax, intergovernmental relations, including written report. Will be at City Council meeting along with ISO representatives to present report with a rating of a 1. We will meet with ISO Friday morning to discuss the change in rating from a 2 to a 1 since station 3 is now open.
- 2. Fire Marshal Report 109 new construction projects. HISD is moving forward with several projects. No new information on the mega site.
- 3. Training Report We had over a thousand hours of training in July. We sent a few more people to ALERT training and came back and taught hour classes here to go over all the information.
- 4. Hutto Professional Firefighters Association Report We are working with school to use the stadium for a 911 stair climb. Also working on our Pink Heals shirt sale for our October fund raiser for breast cancer awareness. Also hoping to have a football game in November to honor veterans. We have been working with Taylor Fire Department to help raise money for a fellow firefighter who just passed away from terminal cancer. We are talking to his wife about keeping the go fund me open and or transferring it to a type of memorial fund in his name and possibly getting with the school district to do some sort of sponsorship to the fire academy.

#### V. REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS

- 1. Discussion and possible action regarding budget for fiscal year October 1<sup>st,</sup> 2022 to September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Commissioner Cano made a motion with a second by Commissioner Hejl to approve the 2022/2023 fiscal year budget as presented. Passed 4-0.
- 2. Discussion and possible action on District's 2022/2023 tax rate, including;
  - a) Take a record vote on the District's 2022/2023 tax rate and adopt an Order Levying Taxes; Commissioner Cano motioned that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.10 per \$100, which is effectively a 25.981% increase in the tax rate and adopt an Order Levying Taxes. Motion seconded by Commissioner Hejl. Record vote taken as follows: Commissioner Cano – yes; Commissioner Hejl – yes; Commissioner Guthrie – yes; Commissioner Brown – yes. Passed 4-0. Miller – absent.
  - b) Authorize filing the Order with Williamson County Tax Assessor/Collector; Commissioner Guthrie made a motion with a second by Commissioner Hejl to authorize the filing of the Order with Williamson County Tax Assessor/Collector. Passed 4-0.
  - c) Acknowledge and approve posting of statement regarding adopted tax rate to home page of District website.

    Commissioner Hejl made a motion with a second by Commissioner Cano to acknowledge and approve posting of statement regarding adopted tax rate to the home page of the district website. Passed 4-0.
- 3. Discussion and possible action on debt service reserve account. Commissioner Hejl made a motion with a second by Commissioner Guthrie to approve moving funds from sales tax account in the amount of \$2,656,199.78 to the debt service reserve account. Passed 4-0.
- 4. Discussion and possible action on the Klattenhoff property for fire station #4. Commissioner Cano made a motion with a second by Commissioner Hejl to approve the first amendment to the contract which changes the name of owners. Passed 4-0. On schedule to close September 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Discussion and possible action on the District's Chris Kelley Blvd. property. Commissioner Cano made a motion with a second by Commissioner Guthrie to extend Mr. Beard's buyer's representative contract for a year and continue to market the property. Passed 4-0.
- 6. Discussion and possible action on Administration building. No new report.
- 7. Discussion and possible action on fire station #3 construction. We are down to one punch item left. September 7<sup>th</sup> at 2pm will be the cornerstone ceremony with the Masonic Lodge. We are looking at November/December for the dedication. Commissioner Hejl made a motion with a second by Commissioner Cano to approve the

- amendment to the contract to extend the warranty out 2 years along with the architect's recommendation that the bonding company extends theirs as well. Passed 4-0.
- 8. Discussion and possible action sales tax contract. No action.
- 9. Discussion and possible action two apparatus purchases. Commissioner Hejl made a motion with a second by Commissioner Guthrie to approve the purchase of the two apparatus as presented. Passed 4-0.
- 10. Discussion and possible approval on FMLA policy. Commissioner Cano made a motion with a second by Commissioner Hejl to approve the FMLA policy. Passed 4-0.
- 11. Discussion and possible approval of Parental Leave policy. Commissioner Hejl made a motion with a second by Commissioner Cano to approve the Parental Leave policy. Commissioner Hejl would like to see how many events and the costs related to this from the past few years and bring back next month. Passed 4-0.
- 12. Discussion and possible action on Fire Chief's evaluation. Board is pleased with the job he is doing and the way he represents the department. Commissioner Cano made a motion with a second by Commissioner Hejl to approve a pay increase of ten percent annually effective immediately for Chief Kerwood. Passed 4-0.
